With reference to our telephone conversation today with Mr. Martin we have to advise you that the above vessel is at present in drydock at this port for Special Survey. The major part of the Special Survey has now been carried out including the drilling of the shell plating and the condition of the vessel after some local repairs to the shell plating will be satisfactory.

The Owners have at this stage requested that the remaining requirements of the Special Survey (Hull and Machinery) be deferred until September, 1960. The Screwshaft Survey now due will be carried out at this time.

The extent of examination for Special Survey carried out at this time complies with the requirements for a General Examination for postponement of Special Survey in accordance with the vessel's age.
