At the beginning of November last the Owners' Agents wrote that this vessel was on her way from Mahe to New Plymouth, N.Z. where she was due to arrive early in January. Last month they wrote that the vessel had arrived at New Plymouth to discharge, but it was probable she would be fixed for a cargo from Melbourne to Mauritius, and would no doubt be drydocked at Melbourne for scraping and painting before commencing to load. The Owners' Agents now write as follows:-

"The above vessel is still discharging in New Plymouth and has not yet been chartered for further business. We are still working on the business from Melbourne to Mauritius but we have today received instructions from the Owner that, if she is not fixed for this business within four days, we are to endeavour to fix her for another voyage from Assumption Island to Auckland, on condition that you are willing to extend her seaworthiness certificate to cover this round voyage. Even if she is fixed for Assumption Island/Auckland, owner wishes to retain the liberty of taking cargo Westwards, before loading at Assumption, if this is obtainable."
