

Case of the Steel S.S. 'Annie,' No: 712 in the  
Reg. Book, built in 1864, classes A- 12/86  
SS No 3- 2/85

SS No: 1 is due. Vessel has been examined  
in dry dock in London and the Surveyor  
reports that he found the plating  
indented in several places, one plate in  
4<sup>th</sup> strake from keel cracked, eight  
frames broken, tunnel in unsatisfactory  
state, deck leaky in a few places, &c.,  
and recommended cargo battens to be  
removed, vessel chipped and frames and  
plating examined inside to ascertain if  
there were any fractures in way of indents,  
also all necessary repairs, as enumerated,  
to be effected, and the requirements of  
S.S. No: 1 complied with. But the Surveyor's  
recommendations have not been  
carried out.

The Classing Committee decided on the  
10<sup>th</sup> instant to expunge the vessel's class  
with a black line thus: - 7,88
