Dear Sirs,

H. I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 10th instant respecting the steamer "STETTIN" and in reply I think it well to inform you that in accordance with the Society's Rules the Special Surveys of this vessel become due at 4, 8 and 12 years respectively from the date of build, and subsequently at the expiration of like periods from the date of the previous Special Survey No.3 as recorded in the Register Book. It will be observed that the 4th Special Survey No.3 of this steamer was held in June, 1915, and the 5th Special Survey No.2 therefore became due at the end of June, 1923.

The case received the consideration of the Committee at their Meeting to-day and they desire me to say that provided a part of the Special Survey be held and the Boiler Survey be carried out and a satisfactory report as to the vessel's condition be received from the Society's Surveyors at an early date, the completion of the Special Survey may be held ~~as before~~ with
