Referring to our previous call at your
office & your letter of 24th June, we beg that you
will lay before your committee the following facts
for their consideration

This vessel was previous to our purchasing her
reclassified under your survey for 13 years A.1. from
December 86 & got in November 90 less than 4 years
afterwards, we were called upon to do very extensive
repairs & further repairs yet remain to be completed
which for us is a most unfortunate matter, as the
vessel was bought by us on the strength of the survey
and reclass of 1886.

You were good enough to allow the vessel to proceed
to Mauritius without finally completing all your
requirements, she sailed from there just completed
delivery of her cargo from Mauritius in Liverpool
in very good condition. Vessel being altered &
had new decker been installed & repaired at a

cost of nearly £1000, we beg to ask that you
will agree to postpone the further examination
of the vessel until she returns from another
voyage which is not likely to be very prolonged
as you are aware she is a very fast one
awaiting your favorable reply
