We are in receipt of your favour of 29th inst, respecting special survey on our composite ship "Thermopylae". We did not understand that this ship's survey was overdue, as she was completely yellow metalled at Rotterdam in May 1890, and we believe surveyed at same time, there. Indeed your own register for 1891-92 states that she was surveyed 5th month 1890, at Rotterdam &c., &c. If we are incorrect in our surmise, will you kindly cable on receipt of this at our expense, "SURVEY NECESSARY" as the vessel is now due at Victoria B.C., and it would be convenient to put her in the Esquimaux Dock, if we are obliged to re-survey as stated by you. In the absence of a telegram we will understand that it is a mistake.
