## REPAIRS OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE, FOR

This vessel has been submitted to completion of special survey, afloat, while undergoing repairs.

The old main deck has been taken up. All iron work of beams, tie diagonals, stringers, plates beneath main deck have been thoroughly cleaned & painted before the new deck was laid. A new main deck of Vancouver Island Pine & Oak, four inches in thickness finished, has been laid, fastened with 7/8 galvanized iron nuts & screws bolts well set down into the deck in oakum & white lead & well watertight.

Coming at fore part of after forecastle deck has been lifted in order to give the main deck planking proper slope within the hull & afterwards replaced & battened, fitted watertight.

The fore deck some has been lifted to remove the old, and lay.
