Sir,

In reply to the remarks contained in your letter of the 6<sup>th</sup> inst. respecting the Boiler Survey of the S.S. "Nederland", I beg to state that the increased pressure mentioned in my Report N<sup>o</sup> 2396 is a mistake which should read: "to ease at 76 lbs and to blow off at 80 lbs, instead of to ease at 80 lbs and to blow off at 84 lbs."

As regards the age of the Boilers, I beg to observe that they were unshipped and practically renewed in 1884 as reported by me then (Report N<sup>o</sup> 962 dated 4<sup>th</sup> October 1884).

I recommend the notation B.S. 6, 92 because the Boilers were examined by me on that date and the safety valves tested on the 25<sup>th</sup> ult.
