Dear Mr. Mayne,

With reference to your official letter of the 3rd instant on the subject of the machinery fees for the new Motorship "GRIPSHOLM", I have been looking at the Copenhagen Report (No. 7087A) and it appears to me - though my conclusion may be wrong - that approximately 4/5ths only of the Rule fee was charged at that Port. Of course, I do not know at what rate of exchange the fees were calculated, but understand that the rate at the date of account - 31st August, 1925 - was around 19.30 (Par Rate 18.16).

The N.H.P. as per Rule according to the report is 2510, which would give Rule fees as follows: -

First Entry £6 : 0 : 0
Special Survey £162 : 15 : 0

The fees charged on the report are: -

First Entry ~~K.R.~~ ^{Kr.} 94.80 = £4.18 0
Special Survey 2571.45 = 133.4 4

Perhaps you would let us have a further letter of instructions, if you consider that the Society might collect an additional fee from this Port.
