

Ltd., attend at their Works on 30th May, 1942, to examine and test one gunmetal liner made to their Order No. H697 for Messrs. T.S. Forster & Sons and intended to be fitted on the Screw Shaft of the s.s. "Emerald".

Tensile test pieces taken from near the top and from the bottom of the casting were broken with under-mentioned results; the liner was found sound and tight under hydraulic pressure of 50 lbs., per square inch and the inside bore good.
