I have surveyed the above ship in accordance with the Rules for Damage to foremast stated to have occurred on 14-7-64 whilst loading cargo at Alexandria. Derricks stated to have been handling a load of 3000 kg when foremast collapsed about 1000m/m below the crosstree.

The items now surveyed are detailed on this report. All were found or placed in good condition unless otherwise stated.

When examined the foremast was found cropped about 1000 m/m below crosstree. This was stated to have been carried out in Alexandria since the uppermast and crosstree had fallen forward and were impeding vision and working of the ship.

Heavy wastage internally was found in the upper part of the mast and the effective thickness found to be 3 m/m. Drill tests were made in numerous places and the mast cropped back to sound material.

In the time available repairs were impracticable and temporary arrangements were made for masthead lighting.

Work was commenced on a new upper section and arrangements made to complete the work on the ships return after one voyage.

The ship is scheduled to return about 20th August and it is recommended that the forward derricks should not be used until the foremast has been permanently repaired.

I recommend that this ship remain as classed ~~xxx~~ without fresh record of dry docking subject to the forward derricks not being used until permanent repairs to foremast have been carried out and to any outstanding conditions of class being dealt with as previously recommended.
