Sir,

I duly received your letter of the 27th ultimo
losing one from Mr. Craig, together with one from Messrs. The
Field Shipbuilding & Engineering Co. respecting the proposed
amended arrangement of wash plates in oil fuel tanks in the S.S.
499 now building by that Firm, and in reply thereto I am
pleased to state that the central part of the wash plates may be
portable, when carrying coal on the voyage out to Sydney and from
Sydney to Vancouver, subject to the portable part of the wash
plates being riveted in place under the supervision of the
Society's Surveyor at Vancouver (at which port it is stated by the
Owners' Representatives the work will be carried out), and
provided the arrangements be as shown and amended on the plan
sent to the satisfaction of the Surveyors, and subject also to
a letter being received from the Owners agreeing to this
arrangement.

The plan showing the amended arrangement is returned
herewith; the plan previously approved has now been cancelled,
