the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of Messrs. Siemens-Schuckertwerke A.G. examine on the 20th February, 1936, at their works in Berlin, one cast steel water-regulating valve of 60 mm. diameter in finished condition, order Witkowitz for s.s. "CONTRE ROSSO", and found the same, so far as can be seen, in compliance with the works' plan.

The valve has been tested to 240 kgs. per sqcm. water pressure and was found tight and sound at that pressure.

It is stated by the makers that the cast steel valve casing was made at the works of Messrs. Welland & Tuxhorn G.m.b.H., Brackwede, and that material tests had not been carried out.

The valve was marked: Lloyd's Test 240 Atm.
