E. I duly received your letter of the 23rd instant, with enclosures advised therein relating to the above installation, and I have to say that your remarks concerning safety valves and the feed pump turbine casings are noted.

With reference to the safety valves, the Makers' proposals could be accepted, provided the valves are found to operate satisfactorily under working conditions and fulfil the requirements of the accumulation test described in Section 21, Clause 6, of the Rules for Engines and Boilers.

I have to request, however, that you will carefully measure the amount by which the valve lifts automatically when discharging steam under the above conditions, and forward this information to this Office.

With regard to the proposal to use cast iron for the feed water turbine casings, it will be appreciated that it is not sufficient to state that similar turbine casings have previously been made, but rather to state whether, after a period of service of some years duration, such casings have been examined and found to be

in good condition.

I shall accordingly be glad if you will ask the Firm whether they can make such a statement regarding those cases mentioned in their list which have been in service three years or more.
