Dear Sirs,

I am in receipt of your C/ll report in the case of the steamer "MANCHESTER REGIMENT", from which it is observed that the tonnage opening, the freeing ports and scuppers in the tonnage well, and the tonnage openings and closing appliances in the bulkheads at the forward and after ends of the well have not been restored.

In the circumstances, you should ascertain from the Owners if it is their intention to proceed with the restoration of these openings with a view to the exemption from tonnage measurement of the tween deck spaces, and the modification of the freeboards.

I may add that the fee for your survey in this instance should be £5 as shewn in Statutory Rules and Orders No.96, page 42 column 2 (for renewal of certificate), and not £4.5.0., as stated on your report.
