CERTIFICATE FOR MACHINERY.

This is to Certify that the Machinery of the
Steel Twin Screw Steamer Hellenic Prince
6522 Tons, of *Hong Kong*
Built at *Sydney N.S.W.* in *1928*
has been surveyed at *Barry & Naples*
in *October 1949 & January 1950*
by the Surveyors to this Society, and reported to be in good,
efficient, and safe working condition, at a pressure of 220 lb.
per square inch on the main ^{W.T.} boilers. The approved working pressure
of the donkey boiler is *X* lb. per square inch.

Book, subject to Periodical Surveys as required by the Rules, & to a
number of tubes being renewed in the port aft & starboard aft main boilers,
& to both propellers being specially examined at the next dry docking.
