Starboard side in way of Engine room:
3 Plates indented.

After Peak Tank Bulkhead.
2 Plates buckled and 2 stiffeners
buckled.

RECOMMENDED:-
To be removed, faired and
refitted.

Plates to be removed,
faired and refitted. Two
stiffeners to be renewed.

The whole of the work to be carried out in an efficient and workmanlike manner together with all incidental removals and replacements, so as to place the vessel in the same condition as before the casualties.
