"SCHELDE", 359 tons gross of Rotterdam as she lay afloat and in drydock in Swansea, on the 25th September, 1943 and subsequently, for the purpose of carrying out a GENERAL EXAMINATION in lieu of SPECIAL SURVEY, and ascertaining the condition of the vessel with a view to renewal of the Load Line Certificate.

The General Examination has been completed and repairs as found necessary for maintenance of sea-worthiness are being carried out with a view to vessel retaining her class, and receiving the notation "Examined 10,43 for a period of twelve months.

The condition of this vessel having been found good, it is recommended a new Load Line Certificate be issued and made valid until the 30th June, 1948.
