Dear Sir,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 11th instant and note the arrangements proposed in connexion with the issue of Irish freeboard certificates to the following vessels:- "LADY CARLOW", "LADY CONNAUGHT", "LADY LEINSTER", "LADY MUNSTER", "MOYALLA", "LUIMNEACH".

The necessary instructions together with an Irish certificate and copy have been forwarded to the Antwerp Surveyors in respect of the steamer "LUIMNEACH" and I have to enclose a certificate and copy for the "MOYALLA" <sup>for issue</sup> when the lettering has been altered to correspond with Irish Law. If an Annual Freeboard Survey is not carried out at this time in this case you should advise the Owners that the next Annual Survey will become due on the 7th April, 1935.

I have to add that Irish certificates have not yet been issued for the steamers "EULIE ANNIE", belonging to the Wexford Steamships Ltd., and "MAIGUE" belonging to the Limerick Steamship Co., Ltd., and I shall be glad if you will be good enough to ascertain from these Owners what arrangements they propose making in the matter. In the case of the former vessel no freeboard survey would appear to have been held since

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"LADY CARLOW" etc.

the issue of the renewal certificate on the 20th November, 1933  
and as regards the "MAIGUE" an Annual Survey was carried out  
in July last.
