Dear Sir,

I have to inform you that the Society's Surveyors at Belfast report that the Larne Shipbuilding Co., of Larne, has gone into liquidation, and that the steamer "BROUGHTY" (Yard No. 80) under construction by that firm is to be towed to the Clyde by the Owners, the Dundee, Perth & London Shipping Co., who are arranging for completion and fitting of engines and boilers.

The hatch covers and tarpaulins have been fitted and the opening boarded up, and in the opinion of the Belfast Surveyors the vessel is in a fit condition to proceed in tow, and a certificate (Cert.B) has been issued by them to this effect.

In these circumstances I shall be glad if you will be so good as to arrange for the case to receive the necessary attention with a view to the ultimate classification of the vessel in the Society's Register Book.

The Society's Surveyors are being requested to forward to you a First Entry Report on the ship made up as far as possible, together with the approved plans, for the information and guidance of the Glasgow Surveyors in carrying out their survey. Belfast Report No. 8540 (Rpt.8) on the Surveyor's examination for the purpose of issuing the seaworthy certificate, is sent herewith for guidance.
