
Dear Sirs,

I am in receipt of Mr. Larg's letter of the 8th instant, intimating that the sum of £1:6:0 has been paid by Mr. Maxwell Jones for the duplicate classification certificates of the Admiralt^{ly} Steam Trawler "THOMAS ALEXANDER", and in reply to your enquiry as to how this amount should be dealt with, I have to say that it should be paid by you into the Bank in the usual way, and on the counterfoil of the receipt you issue you should note: "Lon. A/c"., there will be no need for the amount to be entered in your Rough Fee Book, but the entry should be made in your Debit Book, and the amount entered under the column headed: "Fees due to other Ports".

In the same way the cash payment should be entered in your Cash Book under the column headed: "Fees and Expenses received to the credit of other Ports", and to keep the matter quite in order an advice should be sent to this Office on "A/c 3."
