The remarks of the Chief Ship Surveyor are desired on this case for the consideration of the Classing Committee.

("The endorsement to contain a succinct summary of any repairs that have been required and to show the cause or causes of such repairs, and also to bring out clearly any exceptional features in connection with the case, so that the Classing Committee may have all the salient points presented in the endorsement."—Extract from Sub-Committee's Report, 24/5/34)

The Hamburg Surveyors report this vessel placed in dry dock, the bottom cleaned and coated and minor repairs effected.

The vessel has been converted for the burning of oil fuel and some alterations made to the starboard bunker for the housing of pumps. In addition to the double bottom tanks used as oil fuel bunkers, No.4 tank has been converted to carry oil fuel (See Rpt.9), ^{all} in accordance with approved plans and the requirements of the Rules.

It is submitted the vessel appears worthy to remain as classed with record of survey 10,37.

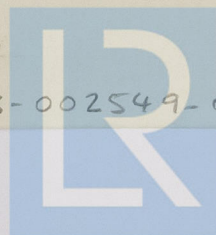
