Memorandum of alterations reported since ship was surveyed for assignment of Load Lines
in

Additional accommodation now fitted at Shelter Tween Decks at aft end on port side for 10 seamen.

Strong companionway of steel, built on Shelter Deck giving access to above accommodation, having substantial wood door 5'0" x 2'0" capable of being operated from both sides. Sill 24" high.

One additional W.C. fitted in way of new accommodation discharging overboard through strong brass storm valve geared to Shelter Deck, having positive means of closing.

Additional side scuttles of strong construction with strong hinged deadlights fitted to new accommodation.

One 8" dia cowl ventilator with strong steel coaming 36" x 36" fitted in way of accommodation and closed by wood plug and canvas cover.

One small steel skylight now fitted to Shelter Deck at aft end.

Small cargo hatch at aft end on Shelter Deck now plated over on port side ^{of hatch} for a distance of 3'8" to suit above stated additional accommodation.
