Dear Sirs,

Steamer "ANDREAS G"

I have your letter of the 15th April and, in reply, would inform you that the facts in this case are that a Certificate was issued by the Piraeus Surveyors in December to cover a voyage to Japan. The London Agents to the former Owners informed this office in March that the ship had been sold to Japanese interests for breaking up and was to be delivered to the purchasers within the next few days. As it was observed from the Shipping Press that the vessel had arrived at Yokohama on the 1st March the case was brought before the Committee on 11th March who gave instructions for the class to be cancelled by the assignment of a notation "To be broken up".

At that time a Screwshaft Survey was very long overdue as well as some other outstanding recommendations requiring attention on arrival in Japan, and it is extremely unlikely that the Committee would have been prepared to maintain class for any further voyage without the Screwshaft Survey being held, even had the new Owners applied for a further extension.


There is no objection to your informing Mr. Hsu in the above terms.
