With reference to our Report No.91427 being forwarded today, we beg to enclose herewith a letter received from the Engine Builders from which it will be noted that they desire the Classification Certificate of Machinery to be forwarded, in triplicate, by return of post in order to be placed on board the vessel before leaving for Brazil.

We understand that the Society's Surveyors at Middlesbrough are submitting a similar request on behalf of the Ship Builders and that the First Entry Report as regards the hull has already been forwarded to you.

Trial of the engines under steam has not yet been carried out and according to present arrangements this is to take place on Thursday the 7th.

The Classification of the machinery, however, has been recommended upon the Report on the assumption that the steam trials will prove satisfactory.

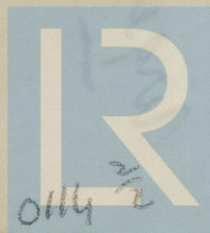
We may add that the casings have been satisfactorily riveted up and the steering engine and windlass will be tried under steam on the 5th instant.
