Dear Sir,

On the 29th August last a radiogram from London addressed to Holmes, Postbox 843, Havana, was received at this Office and following the address given by the remitter, and in the absence of any further directions, instructions were given for it to be posted in one of the Company's envelopes.

We have today received an advice from London informing us that the remitter has complained that the above mentioned radiogram has not arrived at its destination.

In the circumstances we instructed our telephone operator to confirm from you the non-arrival of the radiogram and, on your negative reply, sent you a copy by Messenger No.12 who returned to us a receipt signed by J. Vazquez. We would beg you, however, to confirm, after examining your archives that the radiogram has not been delivered to Apartado 843, to which it was addressed, or remained forgotten in the hands of some employee, as occurred with our telephone message of 9 a.m. of the 9th September, and our letter of the 22nd September.

We extremely regret this incident which is quite foreign to our usual service, and awaiting the information for which we have asked you we remain etc.
