I duly received your letter of the 21st instant regarding the present position of your Motorship "BROWNS BAY", from which it is noted that the Yugoslavian buyers have not yet completed their arrangements for the purchase of this ship but that a cheque for the outstanding survey fees will be passed to this Society immediately this is done or should the vessel be sold to other buyers.

With a view to meeting you as far as possible it has been agreed that immediately on satisfactory settlement of the outstanding fees the Committee will issue a declaration that they have rescinded their decision to expunge the class of the "BROWNS BAY" from the Register Book without further survey. The decision to expunge the class, conveyed to you in my letter of the 16th July last has already been implemented, and the Committee regret they have no alternative but to insist upon settlement of outstanding fees before they rescind it.

With your consent, however, we should be pleased to notify any intending purchasers that this action would be taken immediately the fees were paid and I trust that on reflection you will appreciate that this is the utmost concession the Committee can make in the circumstances.
