were present on the 24th January, 1929 and subsequent dates for the
purpose of examining and testing Steel Steam and Water Drums
and welded muddrums and sections under Job No. 6/124, made to the
order of Messrs. Plenty & Sons, Limited, and intended for vessel
No. 416 built at Greenock by The Greenock Dockyard Co. Ltd.

The steam and water drums, lapwelded muddrums and
sections were tested by hydraulic pressure to 340 pounds per
square inch and satisfactorily withstood the test.

Mechanical tests of the steam and water drums,
muddrums and headers and tubes are in accordance with the
Society's Rules.

Sample header, muddrum, doors and bridges were
subjected to crushing and bending tests with satisfactory
results.
