Dear Sirs,

M. Reverting to Mr. Brydon's letter of the 15th instant, respecting the classification with this Society of the Steamer "WILH. HEMSOTH", I have to acquaint you that the plans forwarded by you have been carefully looked into, and that provided the tween deck hatch webs be made in accordance with the Rule Requirements as indicated on the plans, additional pillars be fitted as indicated on the profile plan, the requirements of Section 48 of the Rules for vessels not built under survey be complied with, the scantlings and arrangements where not indicated on the plans (including the panting arrangements and strengthening of the bottom forward) be found or made to your satisfaction, and on completion of the survey a favourable report be received from you the vessel will be eligible to be classed 100A1 "Part Awning Deck" subject to the freeboards to be assigned by the Committee, the same to be marked on the vessel's sides, inserted in the Certificates of Classification and recorded in the Register Book.

The plans in question are being returned to your address today under separate cover, together with the Certificates of test of the anchors and chain cables, and I have to point out that you should verify the scantlings of the vessel with the plans submitted in English.

You should also forward the necessary measurements and particulars as detailed on Report Form 11c for freeboard assignment.
