scored and about 10 rivets
started.

This plate to be renewed.

In Third strake below sheer
No. 3 plate indented.

To be faired in place.

In fourth strake below sheer
No. 3 plate indented.

To be faired in place.

Bent frames and angles in way of above damage to be repaired as found necessary.

Necessary steaming and cleaning and proving of vessel gas free to effect repairs.

All removals to effect above repairs to be replaced in good condition as formerly.

New and repaired work to be coated.

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The above to be carried out on vessel's arrival at her
port Hamburg, at Owners' convenience.

As a Temporary Repair

The started rivets in No. 3 plate
in Second strake below sheer, in
way of Fore hold, to be renewed and
seams in way of indents to be caulked.
