Motorship "CORYDA"

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In confirmation of our telephone conversation regarding this ship, I have to acquaint you that if she is to proceed in tow from Singapore to Hong Kong for breaking up, the Committee will be agreeable to the surveyors issuing a Certificate to cover the contemplated voyage after a satisfactory General Examination of the hull has been carried out. This certificate will be issued as for an Unclassed ship, and if steam is required during the tow the Donkey Boiler Survey must be held before leaving Singapore.

If the ship is to proceed as a Classed ship, a General Examination of the hull, machinery and electrical installation will be required at Singapore, together with the Donkey Boiler Survey, and the main engine attached bilge pump scrolls will require to be examined.

Perhaps you will be so good as to let me know, in due course, what steps the Owners propose taking.
