Dear Mr. Carey,

I have to acknowledge with thanks your letter of January 23rd relative to the case of the Dredger "RUKAMAVATI".

I wrote to the State Mechanical Engineer, on February 9th and so far I have had no reply.

The officials of these Indian States are very slow to move in any matter, and I have hopes that we may yet receive a satisfactory reply.

The State Mechanical Engineer is a Railway Engineer and does not profess to know anything of ships.

In addition to the lines you suggested I should write him on, I pointed out that without a freeboard certificate the vessel would not be allowed to leave a port in British India.

This is a serious matter, as they are dependant on Karachi for drydocking the vessel.

In view of the time taken by them to reply to my letter I propose to cable you the result when it does arrive.
