Cables: Single, twin, concentric, or multicore are the cables insulated and protected as per Tables IV, V, X or XI of the Rules *Yes.*

COMPASSES.

Distance between electric generators or motors and standard compass 14'

Distance between electric generators or motors and steering compass 14'

The nearest cables to the compasses are as follows:—

A cable carrying 5 Ampères 7 feet from standard compass 11 feet from steering compass.

A cable carrying 0.5 Ampères 8" feet from standard compass 8" feet from steering compass.

A cable carrying Ampères feet from standard compass feet from steering compass.

Have the compasses been adjusted with and without the electric installation at work at full power. *Yes.*

Has the effect of switching on and off circuits, motors and other electro-magnetic apparatus within the vicinity of the compasses been noted. *Yes.*

The maximum deviation due to electric currents was found to be 0 degrees on any course in the case of the standard compass, and 0 degrees on any course in the case of the steering compass.
