I have been in communication with Messrs. Ybarra & Co. with reference to their purchase of the American steamers "President Wilson" and "President Lincoln" and the possibility of these vessels being re-classed with this Society and I have now received a letter from them in which I am informed that the former vessel - now named "CABO DE BUENA ESPERANZA" of Seville - has been reclassified with the Society and with the American Registry, in San Francisco, California.
