This vessel, which was built in 1920 and classed with the American Bureau, has been acquired by the Ministry of Shipping (Managers Douglas and Ramsey), and with a view to classification with Lloyd's Register of Shipping, a Classification Survey S.S. No. 3 has been held.

Some pitted shell plating in way of the laid up water line, especially on the shoulder forward, requires to be dealt with.

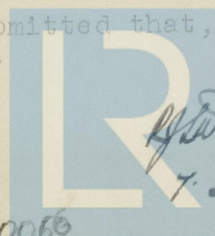
It is stated that the drilling of the shell plating has been postponed, as the Ministry of Shipping did not desire this to be done at this time.

Notations of 100A1 (Classification contemplated) and 'Examined 12.40' were accordingly assigned by the American Committee in January last.

The fee for the Classification Survey on the hull, in accordance with the American scale of fees, is \$817 or £204, and account being taken of what remains, a proportionate fee for the work done at New Orleans is £182. = 90%

The fee for the Classification Survey on the hull if held in this country would be £133, and a proportion of this will remain to be charged if and when the Classification Survey is completed in the U.K. *may 100% = £133*

It is accordingly submitted that, as regards the hull, a fee of £182 be now charged.



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
