DESCRIPTION AND REPAIRS AS PER RULE FOR COMMENCEMENT OF SPECIAL SURVEY "D" (due 11/58) - SHIP 34 YEARS OLD.

The survey held at this time constituted a preliminary examination of the hold, decks and engine boiler spaces in order to advise the Owners of the necessary preparations required in order to comply with the Special Survey.

Part of the hold ceiling was lifted but the structure could not be properly examined as the hold bottom was full of cargo residue and the steelwork in the hold found to be coated with heavy scale.

It was recommended at this time that all spaces be thoroughly scaled and cleaned and presented for further examination. The remaining requirements of the Rules for Special Survey "D" were also made clear to the Owners.

Since this first visit, no further request to attend has been received and reference is made to subsequent correspondence, copies of which are attached.
