Dear Sir,

With reference to your Classing Letter dated 7th instant, respecting Sunderland Report No.31054 on the steamer "TYNDALL" I beg to confirm that the screw stays are pitched and nuted as shown on the approved plan, being as follows:-

Combustion Chamber sides:- $9\frac{5}{8}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ ". Back:- $8\frac{3}{8}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ ".
Top:- $8\frac{5}{8}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ ".

The stays are nuted on both sides with the exception of those through the shell which are nuted inside and riveted outside the shell.

I regret this was not made clear on the report.
