the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of Lloyd's Agents, and with the consent of the Owners, attend on board the S.S. "TUNG FANG", 6458 tons gross, of Hong Kong, whilst in dry dock and subsequently afloat at this Port, for the purpose of ascertaining the nature and extent of damage stated to have been caused by grounding on Little Green Island, Hong Kong Harbour, during typhoon "Wanda", on the 1st September, 1962, and subsequent damage during refloating operations.

For further particulars see log-books.

It was stated that the Nos. 3 & 5 holds, engine & boiler spaces became flooded, and various fuel tanks leaked as a result of the grounding.

During refloating operations, it was stated that it was necessary to partly flood the Nos. 1 & 2 holds, and 1, 2 & 3 'tween decks.

The damage, as found, was considered reasonably attributable to the alleged cause.

A survey was carried out in collaboration with Mr. T. Nicol, the London Salvage Association Special Officer, on various dates from the 7th October, to the 7th November, 1962.

Damage to the shellplating, stern frame, rudder, and internal structure, main and auxiliary machinery, propeller, and boilers was found, and repairs recommended without prejudice to the terms and conditions of insurance. For further details of this damage and recommendations for repair, please refer to the report issued by Mr. T. Nicol.
