EXAMINATION AND REPAIRS AS PER RULE FOR DAMAGE.

Damage stated to have been sustained by navigation in ice on the 19th to 21st February, 1960, on a voyage Stugsund - Harnösand.

DAMAGE REPAIRS NOW EFFECTED:-

Rudder main piece, found distorted, was partly annealed and faired.

Quadrant plate, found partly buckled and fractured, was faired, welded and partly doubled.

The quadrant stop chocks on deck, found loosened and deformed, were removed, repaired and refitted.

Spare steering gear frame, found fractured, was repaired and strengthened.

One break block on starboard side removed, repaired and refitted.

Steering gear tested under working conditions and found working satisfactorily.

Recommended:-

It is recommended the rudder and main piece being removed, specially examined together with quadrant and spare steering gear and dealt with as found necessary at next dry docking before end of April, 1960 (2 mos limit), the vessel not being allowed to navigate in ice in the meantime.

Survey confined to the above.

This vessel, so far as now seen is in good condition and eligible, in my opinion, to remain as now classed without fresh record of survey, (subject to the rudder with main piece being removed, specially examined together with quadrant and spare steering gear and dealt with as found necessary at next dry docking before end of April, 1960, (2 months' limit) the vessel not being allowed to navigate in ice in the meantime and subject to all other conditions that may be attached to the vessel's class being dealt with as previously recommended.
