**This is to Certify** that the undersigned surveyor, Malcolm Matheson, did attend at the Works of Messrs. British Ropes Canadian Factory Ltd., to witness the test of plow steel 6x24 wire rope, 2" in diameter galvanized, Item 2, samples of which were taken from Factory No. 1367, 6720 ft. of which was shipped on Reels 3116 & 3127, 3360 ft. each, on January 5, 1945, consigned to Kaiser Company Inc. Swan Island, Portland, Oregon, on Order PDMC-44-34666, Ref.D.-1498. Torsional tests of the wire of which the rope was made, were made, and the wires twisted around themselves and untwisted (8) times before breaking. Tensile tests were also made of the wires of which the rope was made, and the first test gave 2308 lbs, second 2255 lbs, and the third 2511 lbs, equivalent to an average breaking strain of 110 long tons per square inch.
