The undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of  
Masters' Representative examined anchor chain cable of T.E.S.

"TENACODUS", 10644 tons gross, of London for Special Survey.  
Vessel's Rule Complement is 330 fathoms of stud link chain  
of 2.11/16" diameter wrought iron or 2.5/16" diameter high  
tensile steel

There are 266.1/3 fathoms cable on board:-

Starboard side 132 fathoms of 2.5/16" diameter high tensile steel cable  
Port side 134.1/3 fathoms of 2.5/16" diam. high tensile steel cable.  
132 fathoms Port side and 29.1/3 fathoms starboard side have  
been tested at this time and found satisfactory.

Certificate No. 44487 L.P.H.B.C. 31.5.1948 has been duly endorsed.  
Remaining 105 fathoms on starboard side have not been tested  
at this time. These seven lengths have been taken from the T.E.S.  
"THALAMUS" (at present at Swansea) and fitted to starboard anchor  
of "Tenagodus" (first seven lengths).

Certificate No. P.H. 21824 Pittsburgh 6.3.1945 for 300 fathoms  
of 16" cast steel stud link cable T.E.S. "Thalamus" has been  
endorsed as follows:-

"Seven lengths (105 fathoms) of this cable have been removed  
and fitted on Starboard anchor (first 7 lengths) of T.E.S.
