Extract from the Classification Regulations of the Society:--

REPAIRS AND ALTERATIONS

Repairs

All repairs to hull, equipment and machinery which may be required in order that a ship may retain her class in the Register Book are to be carried out under the inspection of, and to the satisfaction of, the Society's Surveyors. When repairs are effected at a port where there is no Surveyor to this Society, the ship is to be surveyed by one of the Society's Surveyors at the earliest opportunity.

When at any survey the Surveyors consider repairs to be necessary, either as a result of damage, or of wear and tear, they will communicate their recommendations at once to the Owners, or their representative, and if compliance therewith cannot be arranged, immediate notification will be given to the Committee.

Alterations

Plans and particulars of any proposed alterations to the approved scantlings and arrangements of hull, equipment, or machinery are to be submitted for approval and such alterations are to be carried out under the inspection of, and to the satisfaction of, the Society's Surveyors.

APPEAL FROM SURVEYORS' RECOMMENDATIONS

If the recommendations of the Society's Surveyors are considered in any case to be unnecessary or unreasonable, appeal may be made to the Committee, who may direct a special examination to be held.
