EXAMINATION AND REPAIRS AS PER RULE FOR Grounding (Interim certificate)

Attended onboard at the request of the owners' agent on account of grounding stated to have occurred at Læsø on the 16th May, 1962.

Now done:- Vessel examined afloat and partly loaded.

All double bottom tanks, peak tanks and bilges sounded at intervals, and vessel found to be making no water.

A diver has examined the vessel and reported that the bottom is undamaged, the bottom paint only showing signs of having been scraped in some places. The propeller, rudder, sea connections, and bilge keel found in good order.

The captain stated that the steering engine and the rudder had been working satisfactorily after the grounding.

The chief engineer stated that the machinery has been working and manoeuvring satisfactorily after the grounding and that the pumps had been opened up and found satisfactory.

Copy of Interim Certificate and diver's report attached.

It is submitted for the consideration of the Committee that the vessel be placed in dry dock for further examination. at next drydocking.
