Dear Sirs,

I have to acquaint you that it appears from a report received from the Society's Surveyors at Middlesbrough that the new Steamer "RONA" has proceeded to your Port, where the machinery is to be fitted on board by the North Eastern Marine Engineering Co., of Wallsend.

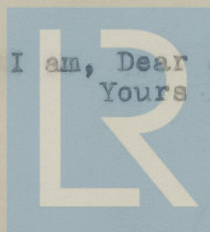
To complete the survey on the Hull, the following requires to be done, viz:-

The steering gear, windlass and winches, to be tested under steam; watertight doors to be tested; casings and skylight to be riveted after machinery is shipped; air and sounding pipes to complete, and two small plates in way of topside tanks on upper deck, each side, to be riveted; arrangement of steering by wire rope to be fitted up for examination. It is also intended to dry dock the vessel and fit the stem extension piece for other gear.

I should be glad if you would be so good as to give the case the necessary attention, reporting thereon in due course for the information of the Committee with a view to the classification of the Vessel.
