Memorandum of alterations reported since ship was surveyed for assignment of Load Lines  
in JULY 1940

## ALTERATIONS.

- 1/ Stores hatch on Forecastle Deck removed, opening in deck plated over. ✓
- 2/ Coal hatches on Bridge Deck, 2P. & 2S. removed, openings in deck plated over. ✓
- 3/ Two coal hatches on Upper Deck, in Bridge space abreast Boiler casings P. & S. removed, openings in deck plated over (Hatches abreast N°3 hatch P. & S. retained.) ✓
- 4/ Saddleback hatch plated over, small opening cut, and hinged steel cover fitted, for access to Galley coal space. ✓
- 5/ Air pipes fitted on Bridge Deck as follows:-  
 1 - 6" dia, P. & S., to N°3 O.B.O.F. tanks, 18" above deck to opening (2) ✓  
 1 - 6" " , P. & S., " N°4 O.B.O.F. " , 18" " " " (2) ✓  
 1 - 6" " , P. & S., " Deep Tanks O.F. " , 18" " " " (2) ✓  
 1 - 6" " , centre " Deep Tank O.F. " , 18" " " " (1) ✓  
 1 - 6" " , P. & S. " Wing Tanks O.F. " , 18" " " " (2) ✓  
 1 - 6" " , P. & S. " Settling Tanks O.F. " , 18" " " " (2) ✓  
 Total number = 11 ✓
- 6/ All above air pipes fitted with gauges and canvas covers supplied. ✓
- 7/ Ash chute removed, and opening in shell plated over ✓
- 8/ Doors to coal chute in Bridge space closed up and welded all round. ✓
- 9/ 12 - bowl ventilator soamings (4-18" dia in fore well 04 and 6-18" dia and 2-15" dia in aft. well 04) now divided. Lower soamings 12" high, riveted to deck. Upper soamings bolted to lower soamings on angle rings, with packing. Bolts water tight spaced and welded to lower soaming rings. Plate blanks, for each lower soaming, stowed adjacent on bulwarks. ✓
