INGER SKOU.—Santiago, Chile, June 10.—Danish motor vessel Inger Skou (Rosario for Callao) sank "to-day" off Punta Ommaley, Messier Channel, southern Chile, after hitting a reef. The 22 members of her crew were saved.—British United Press.

Santiago, Chile, June 10.

—Danish motor vessel Inger Skou sank "yesterday," the Navy reported here to-day. The announcement said the 22 crew members were rescued unhurt by an Argentine ship.—Reuter.

Punta Arenas, June 11.

—Motor vessel Inger Skou reported struck rock and sunk Punta Hume, near exit to Messier Channel; total loss.

INGER SKOU. — Punta Arenas, June 11. — Motor vessel Inger Skou, carrying 1,600 cattle to Callao, struck a rock in dense fog at 9 a.m. June 10, and foundered at 3 p.m. the same day. The accident occurred shortly after passing the English Narrows near Messier Channel. The crew of 34 plus 16 cattlemen were saved and brought to Punta Arenas by the Argentine motor tanker Astrasur. INGER SKOU.—Copenhagen, June 12.—Danish motor vessel Inger Skou grounded on a rock in English Narrows, Messier Channel, on Monday afternoon (June 10). The crew of 34 were rescued by Argentine motor tanker Astrasur and were expected to be landed at Punta Arenas this morning. The master of the Inger Skou reported to owners the night before last that the vessel had grounded on a rock but had subsequently refloated and was lying at anchor awaiting assistance and instructions. Later that night, the Chilean Navy reported that the Inger Skou had sunk.—"Borsen." (See issue of June 12.)

INGER SKOU. — Copenhagen, June 14.—According to a statement made by the master of Danish motor vessel Inger Skou at a maritime inquiry held at Santiago, Chile, yesterday, the vessel sank after having struck a reef in Punta Hume Channel during dense fog.—"Borsen." (See issue of June 15.)
