

 purpose of examining a number of small steel castings made by  
 them to the order of Messrs Davey Paxman, order No. 31/425 and  
 intended to be used in the construction of Admiralty Reinforced  
 Concrete Tugs.

The castings consisting of 27 top half, 27 bottom half  
 bearings and 9 nuts, after being hammered were examined and  
 found so far as could be seen sound and free from blow holes.
