

drydocking.

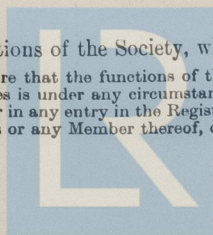
