Steamer "ESSO MARACAY" now named "BAALHAVEN"
Steamer "ESSO PEDERNALES" now named "KATENDRECHT"

The above ships have been laid up in the Lake of Maracaibo since about March, 1958, and in both cases were overdue for drydocking and Main Boiler Survey.

A letter dated 19th January was received from the Curacao Surveyor stating that the ships had been sold to Messrs. N.V. Simons Metaalhandel of Rotterdam and that they were now laid up at that Port.

A cablegram was subsequently received from the Caracas Surveyor stating that the ships had been sold to Curacao under their own power without the overdue Surveys being carried out under the supervision of the Society's Surveyors.

In the circumstances these cases have today been submitted for the consideration of the Committee who had no alternative but to give instructions for a notation to be recorded in the Register Book indicating that the classes of the ships have been expunged on account of non-compliance with the Society's Rules.

I shall be glad if you will inform the new Owners accordingly.
