the Representative of Messrs. Shell Tankers Limited, attend on board the Turbo Electric Tanker "HELICINA" 12167 tons gross of London, as she lay at anchor in the Blackwater at West Mersea, on the 2nd January 1961, for the purpose of examining closing arrangements on exposed decks, casings and superstructures, prior to the vessel being towed as a hulk from the River Blackwater.

The closing appliances of all openings in the Freeboard Deck, Superstructures and Casings, have been examined at this time, and found in satisfactory condition.

The ship is in my opinion, fit to proceed in tow, as a hulk, from the River Blackwater direct to a North East Coast Port, the adequacy or efficiency of the towing arrangements not being the responsibility of this Society.
